Baggies Battle Cry is the work of Smethwick born, West Bromwich Albion season ticket holder, Steve Skidmore - known in music circles as 'Skidders' (after his surname, not his underpants). He is member of Leamington Spa based acoustic duo Bukechi, writing and recording his own music as well as with Bukechi. Skidders also plays electric, acoustic and bass guitar as a session musician for bands such as Beneva, singer/songwriter NaTasha & Paul Hogg and once Smethwick-based Kevin Rowland of Dexys Midnight Runners, at such venues as the Forum and the world famous Cavern Club in Liverpool.

The first version of Baggies Battle Cry was released last year into the British Charts as an instrumental, but after feedback from various quarters, it was clear a version with lyrics was required to drive the Hawthorns' crowd. So Skidders drafted his musical partner of Bukechi, Sammi Houston, to lay down her amazing vocals. Joined by rap virtuoso Tat Supreme who has performed with the likes of number one group Nizlopi, Baggies Battle Cry's second release was 16th March 2008.

"Sammi has an amazing voice", said Skidders.

"She always thrills our audiences and we are hoping this new single will amaze the Baggies fans".

The single is available from iTunes or by SMS text "WBA" to 82822. CDs will be available and sold at selected records stores, such as *Swordfish Records* in Birmingham.

Skidders who lived in Smethwick and Oldbury (in *Dog Kennel Lane*, where the Hawthorns Club used to be and adjacent to *Bristnall Hall Lane* where Frank Skinner lived and was brought up), now lives in Royal Learnington Spa and has his own recording studio *Breac Studios* and Indie record label *Breac Records*.
